Minnesota Water Garden Society

he Minnesota Water Garden Society (MWGS) will be outdoors in the Garden Fair selling a wide variety of hardy and tropical plants that like it damp, wet, or submerged. Great for rain gardens, bogs, ponds, containers, and that wet spot in the yard. MWGS has expanded its offering of large tropical plants, especially taro, canna, and papyrus, since those are not available at the Friends School Plant Sale. MWGS also sells pond fish: koi, shubunkin, and goldfish. Consult with knowledgeable water gardeners on your needs and desires before you buy.

MWGS was founded in 1997. Its mission is to increase enjoyment and enthusiasm for water gardening through promotion, education, and shared experiences.

Carnivorous

Pitcher Plant *Sarracenia* All will be 5-year-old blooming size. These are greenhouse-started with actively growing traps. Pitcher plants require winter dormancy, special growing medium, and mineral-free water, but are surprisingly easy to grow. Care instructions included with each purchase. \bigcirc **3" or 3.5" pot \$25.00**

Formosa (NEW) Sarracenia x formosa (S. minor x psittacina) Low rosette of dense pinky red tubes develop deepest color in full sun. Scarlet flowers before the traps emerge, but last throughout the season. 4–6"h

Maroon (NEW) Sarracenia purpurea x rubra Dark maroon traps all season, including winter. Fragrant dark red flowers bloom in early spring. 6–8"h Zone 5

Northern Purple *Sarracenia purpurea purpurea* Native MN pitcher. Deep reddish-purple very stout, waxy pitchers. Holds color through winter. Dark red fragrant flowers. 4-8"h

White Trumpet *Sarracenia leucophylla* White areoles (windows) dominate the upper portions of the tubes, attracting many flying insects. Produces a few nice traps in the spring, then large vigorous traps in fall when other pitcher plants dwindle. 8–28"h Zone 5

Angelica, Korean Angelica gigas Blooms burgundy in fall through hard freeze. Striking plant for moist woodland or bog. $\bigcirc \bigcirc \bigcirc \bigcirc 36-60$ h 4" pot \$4.00 and 6" pot \$7.00

Blazing Star, Floristan Violet (ID) *Liatris spicata* Bright violet-purple flowers on a spike blooming top to bottom over four weeks or more. Cultivar that is slightly more compact than the native. () 36–48"h 4" pot \$4.00

Brooklime, European Veronica beccabunga Spectacular creeper over the sides of containers, in streams and along the pond edge. Glossy green foliage stays all summer long with tons of periwinkle blue flowers in spring. $\bigcirc \mathbb{O} \ \mathbb{O$

Butterbur *Petasites hybridus* Huge leaves. Likes moist woodlands or bogs. Deer- and rabbit-resistant. ● ● 36–48"h 1 *gal. pot* \$7.00

Cardinal Flower, White (THE Lobelia cardinalis alba Bright white flower spikes early to midsummer attract pollinators. Great for cutting. ○ ① ● 24–36"h 4" pot \$4.00

Lizard's Tail Saururus cernuus Heart-shaped 6" green leaves alternate along a slender stem. Long weeping panicles of white flowers at the tips of the stems look like a lizard's tail. $\bigcirc \bigcirc$ 18–36"h **2**" **pot \$5.00**

Marsh Marigold, Double (NEW) Caltha palustris 'Plena' Rare double flowering variation of our beloved Minnesota native marsh marigold $\bigcirc \oplus 6-12$ "h 1 qt. pot \$15.00

Rush, Pickerel Pink *Pontederia cordata* 'Pink Pons' Tall glossy elongated leaves start late, but put on a beautiful all-summer show. Pannicle of rosy pink flowers mid- to late summer. $\bigcirc \mathbb{O}$ 24–36"h 1 *qt. pot* \$15.00

Sedge, Bowles Golden Carex elata Bright gold tufted foliage with thin green margins. Moisture-loving grass that needs to be constantly wet or moist to thrive. **● ●** 24–30"h **2" pot \$7.00**

Sweet Flag, Varigated Acorus calamus variegata Iris-like foliage with unusual vertical variegation. Maintenance-free. \bigcirc 24–36"h *bareroot* \$3.00-\$10.00

Thalia, Powdery Thalia dealbata Clump of long, paddle-shaped blue-green foliage atop strong upright stems. Packed panicles of purple flowers sit at the end of a long arching stem. Zone 6 \bigcirc 36–72"h **2**" pot \$5.00

Water Baby's Breath, European Alisma plantago aquatica Hosta-like plant for the water. Provides a flourish of white to blush tiny flowers on a tall spike. $\bigcirc \oplus 24-36$ "h 4" pot \$6.00

Water Celery Oenanthe javanica Great filtering bog plant with celery-like foliage and flowers. $\bigcirc \oplus 8-15$ "h 6" pot \$5.00

Yerba Mansa (III) Anemopsis californica Sturdy thick oblong green leaves turn shades of gold and orange in fall. Spray of bright white petals surround a long conelike stigma. Zone 5 () 12–24"h 2" pot \$5.00 and 1 gt. pot \$15.00

Lotus Nelumbo nucifera

All lotus are Minnesota-hardy bareroot tubers. Prices vary depending on size, number of growing tips, and variety. Multiple prices are available in each variety. Varieties are selected for prolific blossoms in our climate and are priced for every budget, but under \$15.00 may be too small to bloom this year. Ai Jiangnan () Huge flowers of cheery yellow with green tips on first day of blooming, adding some creamy pink on subsequent days held above low and wide blue-green leaves. M

Beijing Temple of Heaven (TEW) Super-saturated pink

Maggie Belle Slocum Classic pointed lotus flowers of deep fuschia. Large and free-flowering. L

Minnesota Native Yellow *Nelumbo lutea* (III) Our native Minnesota lotus! Warm creamy yellow flowers with deep green leaves can be seen from afar. L

Nanjing Love 16 (Yu Hua Qing 16) (III) Winner of China's National Lotus Competition. Creamy white with purple-violet on outer petals and green tips on inner petals. SM

Sing Birdie Sing Lovely white petals are rimmed in deep purple-pink. Can be grown in a very small pot. A MWGS favorite from 2021. Also grown at Como Conservatory in their Bonsai Garden Display. SM

Somahai (N) Perfect classic dense deep pink flowers stand high above leaves. Light pink centers retain deep pink tips as it ages. M

Tender Love (Lian Ai) MWGS best red lotus from 2021. Blooms continuously throughout summer with singlepetal deep red flowers. Highly recommended for a novice grower. S

Tulip Lotus (Shirokunshi) **NEW** Blooms all summer long with white classic single-petal flowers. L

White Phoenix (Bai Feng Guang) (Perfect for tabletop. Incredible number of blossoms on a compact plant, can be grown in a microbowl. Mini

Yileen Garden (TET) A lotus grown for eating! Baseballsized tubers. Grow in a sunken kiddie pool for best results. Infrequent white blooms. XL

Arrow Arum Peltandra virginica Dense clump of arrowhead leaves with reddish stems and calla lily-like flowers. $\bigcirc \bigcirc 18-24$ " 3" pot \$5.00

Arrowhead, Broadleaf *Sagittarius latifolia* Small white flowers in spring. Grown for large arrowhead-shaped leaves. Edible tuber. ●● 18–24"h **2 tubers \$5.00 and 1 qt. pot \$15.00**

Aster, Red-Stemmed (III) Aster puniceus Abundance of small light violet-blue flowers with yellow centers. Blooms late autumn past first frost. Native habitat is spring-fed swampy meadows. () 48–96"h 4" pot \$4.00

Blazing Star, Marsh *Liatris spicata* Erect spike of rosepurple flowerheads with grass-like leaves extending up the stem. $\bigcirc \bigcirc 36-48$ h **4" pot \$4.00**

Bog Bean *Menyanthes trifoliata* Three-lobed leaves grow from rhizomes along the water surface. Trailing roots good for fish spawn. ○● *bareroot \$3.00*

Bulrush, Soft-Stemmed Schoenoplectus tabernaemontani Graceful blue-green cylindrical foliage. Less aggressive than cattails. $\bigcirc \oplus 24-72$ "h 6" pot \$7.00

Calla Lily, Native (TH) *Calla palustris* Plant along slowmoving stream banks, in bogs, or in a floating island. Thick waxy leaves with a bright white calla flower in late spring. $\bigcirc \oplus 6-12^n$ *bareroot \$4.00*

Cardinal Flower, Red *Lobelia cardinalis* Bright red tubular flowers July–September. ○● 24–48"h **4" pot \$4.00** and 1 qt. pot \$15.00

Green Maiden A semi-double soft pink lotus with green undertones, it occasionally produces a lucky double flower on a single stem. Very easy to grow. MiniS

High Cotton Pure white wide outer petals hold more narrow curled inner petals with bright gold stamen and green receptacle. L

Impressions of West Lake (TEW) Early and often bloomer with deep red perfect shape, and flowers high above leaves. L

Lady Bug Itsy bitsy, teeny tiny, little love bug of a lotus! A bright red little powerhouse that blooms almost nonstop. Can be grown in a bowl or larger pot for larger lotus. Mini

Horsetail, Dwarf *Equisetum scirpoides* Darling miniature with fine segmented foliage $\bigcirc \oplus 4-8$ "h **3" pot \$5.00**

Iris, Blue Flag Iris versicolor For shallow water or rain garden. \bigcirc () 18–24"h

Mallow, Rose *Hibiscus laevis* Our only native hibiscus. Large, five-petaled, hollyhock-like flowers (to 6" diameter) with white to pink petals and maroon eyes on smooth stout stems. Blooms midsummer into fall. Late to leaf out in spring. Tolerates short periods below water. 48–72"h **4" pot \$4.00**

Mare's Tail *Hippuris vulgaris* Soft bottlebrushlike stems rise above shallow water. Native version of parrot feather. $\bigcirc \oplus$ 6–12"h **1 qt. pot \$15.00**

Marsh Marigold Caltha palustris First to bloom in spring. Bog charmer with cup-shaped yellow flowers. $\bigcirc \bigcirc \bigcirc 6-12$ "h 4" pot \$4.00, 1 qt. pot \$15.00, 1 gal. pot \$20.00

Milkweed, Sullivant's Asclepias sullivantii (ID) More uniform pink flower color and less aggressive than common milkweed, handling slightly more damp soil. Excellent hummingbird/butterfly attractor. \bigcirc 24–36"h **4" pot \$4.00**

Milkweed, Swamp *Asclepias incarnata* Easily grown in poor to average moist to wet soil. This native narrow-leaved bloomer is particularly attractive to monarchs for both nectar and larva. \bigcirc 36–60" **4" pot \$4.00**

Monkey Flower, Lavender Mimulus ringens Snapdragon-like lavender flowers. For pond edge or rain gardens. ○ ● 36–48"h **4" pot \$4.00** and 6" pot \$7.00

Spatterdock *Nuphar advent* **(I)** Large heartshaped leaves float on the water's surface with flowers held above water like golden yellow tennis balls on a stick. Grow under 12–36" of water. ○ 36" spread *tuber \$30.00*

Sweet Flag Acorus americanus Strong sword-like leaves stand green and tall all season long. Fragrant tubers give the plant its name. ○ ● 24–36"h **4" pot \$4.00**

Vervain, Blue *Verbena hastata* Deep blue-violet flower spikes bloom for up to months. Individual plants are biennial, but may colonize slowly by rhizomes from the fibrous roots. 24–60h" **4" pot \$4.00**

Water Smartweed Persicaria amphibia (T) Tightly packed racemes of pinkish red to white flowers flourish June to September. Hibiscus, Red Night (H) Hibiscus acetosella Maroon-red foliage looks like a Japanese maple. Pink flowers open at night. Fertilize heavily and prune early for more blooms. () 36–48"h 4" pot \$7.00

Mosaic Plant *Ludwigia sedioides* Floating rosettes in a unique diamond geometric pattern and small yellow flowers. A conversation starter. Surface trailing. \bigcirc *bareroot 2 stems \$8.00*

Papyrus, Compact Giant (■) *Cyperus papyrus* Smaller version of 'King Tut', classic Egyptian papyrus with strong triangular stems and a huge fluffy puff of greenish flower spikelet at the top. () 36–60"h 1 qt. pot \$12.00 and 2.5 gal. pot \$30.00

Parrot Feather Myriophyllum aquaticum Feathery foliage for pond edges, in streams, or containers. Softens rock edges. Trailing. **● ●** 4" pot \$7.00 and 1 qt. pot \$15.00

Myriophyllum spp. Miniature version of parrot feather with red stems. Great in small containers. Trailing. • • *bareroot 3 stems \$5.00*

Radican, Marble Queen (III) Echinodorus cordifolius Amphibious plant can grow underwater, or above. Above is a show: sword plant leaves with very pronounced speckled creamy white variegation. White flowers on long arching stalks. (● 18–24"h 2" pot \$5.00

Sedge, Stargrass Rhynchospora colorata Showy addition to a bog or water garden. It will also grow in regular garden soil with plenty of water. $\bigcirc \oplus 12-15$ "h 2" pot \$5.00

Sensitive Plant, Large Leaf (III) Aeschynomene fluitans Airy fronds of leaves, spaced out over the length of the stems spreads by rhizome. The dainty yellow flowers appear over the lovely green foliage. Larger than normal sensitive plant. Makes an excellent filter. ○ ① 36–72"h bareroot 2 stems \$6.00

Snowflake, Yellow (IEI) Nymphoides geminata Small mottled leaves rest on surface of water. Star-shaped, fringed yellow flowers. Perfect for containers. Surface trailing. () bareroot 2 stems \$10.00

Society Garlic, Variegated Tulbaghia violacea 'Variegata' Fast-growing clump of beautiful cream and bluish green variegation with lavender garlic-like flowers. ○ ● 12–18"h 2" pot \$5.00 and 1 qt. pot \$15.00

Spider Lily, Variegated Hymenocallis caribaea variegata (III) Showy umbels of vanillascented pure white flowers opening to look like a spider blooming midsummer to late fall. Strongly variegated foliage all season long. ○ (12-24"h 4" pot \$7.00

Water Hyssop (▲ Bacopa monnieri Matforming creeping ground cover with small glossy leaves that blooms continuously. Fivepetal small pinkish white flowers. ○ 12–36"h 3.5" pot \$7.00

Water Lettuce *Pistia stratiotes* Floating plant great for filtration and containers. Fuzzy-leaved rosettes. ● ● 4–8"h *bareroot \$6.00*

Water Petunia, Pink Chi Chi Ruellia brittoniana Dark green foliage on long stems covered with pink petunia-like flowers. ○● 24–36"h 2" pot \$5.00

Water Snowball *Gymnocoronis spilanthoides* South American native with trailing stems along the water and white pompom flowers. Can be cut back to promote more branching flowers. $\bigcirc \oplus 12-18$ "h **1** *qt. pot* \$15.00

Water Zinnia Wedelia trilobata Very prolific bloomer with small, yellow daisy-like flowers along fuzzy stems. Green serrated leaves on a tough, easy to grow ground cover. Trailing. ○ ● 2" pot \$5.00 1 qt. pot \$15.00

Waterlily Nymphaea

All these varieties are winter-hardy in Minnesota. Pricing depends on variety, size and growing eyes on the tubers. Multiple prices exist in the same variety. Arc-en-ciel Best pads on a hardy waterlily: olive green speckled with cream, pink and yellow. Large very spiky flowers held above water. Soft pink fades to blush. ○ SM
